Thanksgiving Blessings in Christ... By Pastor Leland Lantz

Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

What beautiful words of advice Paul gave the church in Thessalonica! They are for us today as well. **Be joyful always** – Don't you love to be around people who are full of joy, smiling, happy, laughing, and praising the Lord? Even people I know from our congregation who have every right to be sad or even angry because of their circumstances still overflow with joy and optimism. The answer is in the verse... **pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances.** As I turn to prayer, God softens my heart; He redirects my selfish thinking, gets rid of my pride, builds up my courage, and gives me a new outlook. 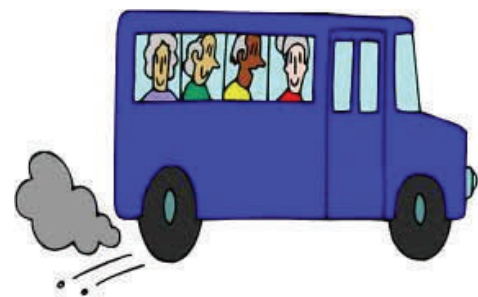
It's that time of year again for the fall clothing drive.

The clothing will once again benefit Orange County Rescue Mission and Working Wardrobes, a non-profit organization that provides nice clothing to people in need, to dress for job interviews. Clothing items will be collected at the Laguna Woods campus and can be dropped off in the library area. Please do not bring any donations before this time as storage space is very limited and we do not want to disrupt space that is used for church ministry purposes any longer than we need to. Also, because of the nature of its ministry, "Working Wardrobes" has given the following guidelines for the clothing they can accept:

- Casual and professional men's, women's and teen clothing
- Must be cleaned, pressed and on hangers if possible
- Size identified - especially with men's suits
- No broken zippers, missing buttons, tears or stains
- Purses and shoes in good condition are accepted
- Men & women's accessories (scarves, belts, earrings, necklaces, shoes & ties) are accepted & greatly needed
- New packages of panty hose and men's boxers are accepted
- Unopened personal care products and travel size personal care products are accepted

We will be boxing the clothing the morning of Monday, November 15th for anyone who may be interested in helping. Thank you in advance for your consideration and donations for these two important ministries! Let us remember Jesus' words in Matthew 25:36, "I needed clothes and you clothed me." 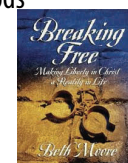

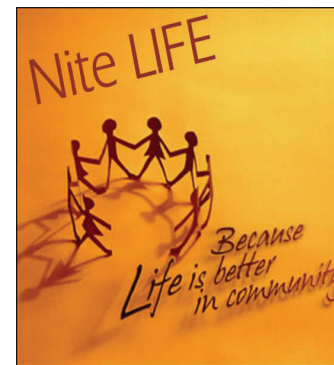

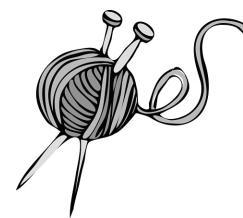


Nite LIFE!


